Divine Politics represents an invitation to reflect deeply on the relationship between spirituality and public life. It is a call for political practices to be in tune with the highest and most universal values, promoting a more just, harmonious society centred on the common good. By adopting this

perspective, leaders and citizens are encouraged to act with ethical awareness, always seeking a balance between material progress and spiritual fulfilment, for the benefit of society as a whole.

The Spirit Joanna de Ângelis, in the book "Mundo Regenerado" (Regenerated World), advises that "the Politics of Jesus is one in which love prevails over all imaginable possibilities.

"Love for the order established by the Divine Laws, which must prevail as guidelines for safety in all situations that arise in the course of existence.

Love for the duties of fostering progress and stimulating it through a perfect balance between different lines of thought and ideas..."

Whenever the debate of ideas descends into aggression against its bearer, love fails in its mission of unity and brotherhood. We move from the politics of good, which should be the structure of all efforts, to that of force, of imposing disrespect for the Sovereign Codes of Life.

Such an occurrence demonstrates the fragility of reason in the face of facts, of the exhaustive examination that must be applied before diverging and dissenting, being a victim of egoic passions and dictator of the way of living and working...

We are currently experiencing a period in which the power of force, due to the benefits it provides to its bearer, becomes valid, in flagrant disregard for the objectives that enable the construction of peace and progress in the world, a regrettable path that begins in the form of disagreement among members of society...

Ethical and moral values

In the Spiritist view, ethical and moral values are connected in a way that unites the reflection of our actions and their individual and collective consequences with our behaviour in all areas of our lives: family, work and society.

Jesus Christ taught morality and ethics, in addition to love, for the progress of humanity, and the Spiritist doctrine encourages this practice for the development of virtues such as charity and justice, with a focus on good interpersonal relationships and the construction of a fraternal world.

Therefore, the ethical values advocated by the Spiritist doctrine are: moral charity (genuine love for others on a daily basis), indulgence (the virtue of not judging others), tolerance (respect for differences), self-knowledge and inner reform (education that transforms habits and consciousness), and the law of cause and effect (the importance of virtuous actions for evolution).

And the moral values are: solidarity (giving to ease the pain of others), social justice (active intervention for a more just society), social responsibility (actions to achieve a better world), progressivism (seeking advances for the good), fraternity (love and unity among all beings).

Therefore, it can be concluded that the rule of good conduct is to distinguish good from evil, based on observance of God's laws.

Emerging powers and social transformations



Joanna de Ângelis' psychological proposal, in light of Spiritist Doctrine, offers a lucid reading of this scenario. According to the author, humanity is going through a transition phase: the old world of the ego is giving way to a new era of consciousness and spiritual integration. The social, moral, and emotional crises we are witnessing are symptoms of a collective birth, in which human beings are called upon to awaken their inner powers, which are not measured by strength, but by the capacity to love, understand, and serve.

These emerging powers do not refer to new technologies, but to new forms of consciousness, new capacities that are awakening in human beings, both psychologically and spiritually, as humanity evolves. They are the forces of the spirit, namely: intuition, empathy, gratitude and love. These powers, which have always existed in the human soul but were inactive, are reorganising psychic and social life, making individuals more upright and society

more supportive. This is an evolutionary advance that unites reason and feeling, science and spirituality, in a proposal for the wholeness of the being, which recognises the divine presence within itself and translates what it identifies as itself into ethical and constructive attitudes.

Hence, the social transformations that are multiplying before



our eyes are not only political or economic; they are essentially spiritual. Humanity learns, through pain and experience, to replace the power of domination with the power of consciousness. The future that is coming belongs to the most conscious, those who understand that true progress is not in conquering the outside world, but in illuminating one's own inner world, as already announced and lived by Jesus Christ.
